## **Academic and Community Partnerships**

Authentic engagement requires development of sustainable and reciprocal partnerships between the university and community. It is also key to creating transformative service-learning experiences for students and their faculty mentors as part of collaborative and dynamic relationships in the community. Ms. Scott spoke on the necessity of collaborative partnerships in battling significant issues such as systemic poverty. She also noted the value of service-learning as an engagement methodology, and the significant impact it can have as a "transformational" rather than "transactional" process.
