## **Job Summary**

Directs the University Risk Management, Safety and Environmental Health, and Insurance programs to provide a safe and secure working environment.

### **Essential Functions**

- 1. Provides guidance to University staff regarding risk management, safety and environmental health, and insurance policies as they apply to University initiatives, projects and programs.
- 2. Develops and implements short and long term strategic plans for assigned units related to risk management, safety and environmental health and insurance.
- 3. Analyzes policies, procedures, programs, and projects for potential financial and operational effects on the University and provides recommendations and solutions to negative effects.
- 4. Manages risk financing for University.
- 5. Collaborates with counsel/attorneys on litigation, potential litigation, and claims and represents the University in defense or settlement discussions as needed.
- 6. Prepares and manages budgets for assigned departments.

## **Supervisory Responsibility**

Supervises others with full supervisory responsibility.

The above essential functions are representative of major duties of positions in this job classification. Specific duties and responsibilities may vary based upon departmental needs. Other duties may be assigned similar to the above consistent with the knowledge, skills and abilities required for the job. Not all of the duties may be assigned to a position.

Knowledge of Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) regulations, risk management, safety and environmental health programming, and Federal, State and Local laws related to hazardous materials and waste management.

### **Certification or Licensure Requirements**

Associate in Risk Management (ARM) or Chartered Property Casualty Underwriter (CPCU), or Certified Risk Manager; Graduate degree in risk management/insurance may substitute for certifications.

# **Physical Requirements/ADA**

No unusual physical requirements. Requires no heavy lifting, and nearly all work is performed in a comfortable indoor facility.
