



Finalizing Your Admission

To confirm your place at Auburn University, you must complete all of the following by the deadlines given below:

Activate your Auburn user account.

Visit auburn.edu/activate for instructions to enable your Auburn account. Once your account is activated, you will be able to log in to AU Access—your Auburn account portal. You will also be able to log in to Tigermail (your Auburn email account) which will be the official form of communication from Auburn University. It is important to activate your account first as you will need access to these tools to complete your admission acceptance.

2 Submit your \$250 enrollment deposit.

You must submit your enrollment deposit by the following dates: Summer term – May 1 Fall term – May 1

Spring term – November 1

Submit your enrollment deposit online via AU Access or visit auburn.edu/admissions/deposit. This deposit is non-refundable and will be applied toward your first semester tuition and orientation fees. Charges incurred prior to registration will be billed separately and should be paid accordingly. All students are required to pay the enrollment deposit including pre-paid tuition participants and athletic scholarship recipients. If you are accepted after the deposit deadline, you have 15 days from your acceptance date to submit your enrollment deposit. This is not a deposit for university housing.

Register your phone with Duo 2-factor authentication.

Register your device with Duo 2-factor authentication, Auburn's mobile security system by visiting *auburn.edu/2factor*.

Register for Camp War Eagle Orientation.

Deadline: June 1

Your enrollment deposit must be received to register for Camp War Eagle. Beginning in March, the First Year Experience Office will mail registration information to students who have submitted their enrollment deposit.

Freshmen enrolling in the spring must attend SOS (Successfully Orienting Students) instead of Camp War Eagle.

Send the final copy of your high school transcript.

Upon graduation, have a final copy of your high school transcript sent to

Student Housing

Are you looking for a convenient, supportive environment and the chance to develop lasting friendships? On-campus living is for you. The Hill, Quad, Village, South Donahue and Cambridge residential areas at Auburn will be your home away from home.

IMPORTANT NOTES

The housing application will be available once you have been accepted. Apply for housing as soon as possible to guarantee your spot and to increase your chance of being placed in your preferred housing option.

On-campus housing for freshmen is limited.
We currently accommodate approximately 65% of

our freshman class in oncampus housing. Please be mindful that we cannot guarantee on-campus housing and will initiate a standby list when the number of housing applications exceeds capacity. Incoming freshmen are not required to live on campus. Please visit offcampushousing. auburn.edu for offcampus options. Your enrollment deposit is NOT a deposit for housing. A separate housing pre-payment must be submitted with your housing application.

Cancellation of housing does NOT imply cancellation of admission.



Orientation

CAMP WAR EAGLE

Camp War Eagle (CWE) is Auburn's orientation program for incoming freshmen and their families. While at CWE, you will learn about university services and activities, meet with academic advisors in a group setting to help you decide what classes to take, register for fall semester classes and connect with other students and families. Students will also meet their CWE counselor, a current Auburn student, who will help prepare them for success as a new student. Orientation materials will be mailed in mid-March to students who have submitted their enrollment deposit. The deadline to register for CWE is June 1. SPRING TERM FRESHMAN

Freshmen accepted for spring term will attend a Successfully Orienting Students (SOS) orientation in the fall. For more information about SOS, please visit *fye.auburn.edu/sos*.

Duo 2-Factor Authentication

Duo is a 2-factor authentication tool which requires the student to provide login credentials AND proof of identity via a second device, such as a smart phone, before granting you access to an online resource. Accepted students will be required to use Duo to complete class registration and CWE registration as well as other tools here at Auburn. Visit *auburn.edu/2factor* to register your device. As a reminder, the Duo 2-factor authentication is for student use only. Please do not register parents' devices.





Medical Form

A medical information form must be submitted online prior to your enrollment at Auburn. The AU Medical Clinic uses the Clearwave system to collect your medical information. Look for your unique activation link in your Tigermail account to set up your account. Go to *auburn.edu/medicalform* for more information. Scholarships and Financial Aid

SCHOLARSHIPS

Following acceptance, incoming freshmen must complete the scholarship application through the Auburn University Scholarship Opportunity Manager (AUSOM) by 4:45 p.m. CST on December 15 to receive consideration for all scholarships. The minimum test score and high school GPA required for consideration must be reflected on the applicant record within AUSOM by December 15. Following receipt by Auburn, it may take up to three days before test scores and GPAs are updated in AUSOM.

Incoming students are not required to submit the enrollment deposit to apply for scholarships and are only required to complete the scholarship application once each academic year. To complete the scholarship application and search for scholarships, visit AUSOM on Admitted Students or My Finances in AU Access.

Students should complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)*, available October 1 at *fafsa.ed.gov*. Need-based scholarships may be awarded to incoming freshmen beginning in January. This will require the FAFSA, available October 1 at fafsa.ed.gov, to also be received by December 15. Students selected for FAFSA verification will not be eligible for financial aid, including need-based scholarships, if that process is incomplete. The FAFSA, and other requirements if necessary, should be received by February 1 for priority consideration of all need-based scholarships.

FINANCIAL AID

More than 60% of Auburn students receive some type of financial assistance. Students interested in receiving financial aid should complete the FAFSA*, available October 1 at *fafsa.ed.gov*.

*The FAFSA is the only form a student is required to complete to be considered for student assistance from any of the Title IV HEA programs, except for information needed to ensure the student's eligibility for such assistance (e.g., information needed to complete verification or to demonstrate compliance with the student eligibility provisions of the HEA and the regulations). Additional information, if requested, will be listed on the student's AU Access My Finances page after results of the FAFSA are received. For additional information, visit auburn.edu/finaid.
