THE COMER MEDAL FOR EXCELLENCE IN NATURAL SCIENCE, established in 1923 by the Honorable Braxton Bragg Comer, Birmingham, Alabama, and after his death endowed by his heirs. *Alicia Rose Brooks*, Schenectady, N. Y.

THE MEDAL OF THE AMERICAN INSTITUTE OF ARCHITECTS. This medal is conferred annually on the architectural graduate who has made the best scholarship record throughout the entire course. It is accompanied by a copy of Henry Adams' great work on Mont St. Michel and Chartres, and is awarded this year to: *Wallace Eugene Treadaway*, Montgomery, Ala.

THE ALABAMA SOCIETY OF ARCHITECTS DESIGN PRIZES. The Alabama Society of Architects offers annually prizes for excellence in design. The amounts are to be used by the winners for the start of a professional library. This year the awards are: 1st Prize in Architectural Design (\$15.00), *Carl Herbert Lancaster, Jr.*, Montgomery, Ala. 2nd Prize in Architectural Design (\$10.00), *Robert Dale Wise*, Birmingham, Ala. Prize in Construction Design (\$10.00), *Edward Milton Paul, Jr.*, Birmingham, Ala. Prize in Landscape Design (\$10.00), *Charles Taliaferro Spivey*, Macon, Ga.
