The Bachelor of Science degree in Nutrition/Dietetics is accredited by the Accreditation Council for Nutrition and Dietetics as a Didactic Program in Dietetics (DPD). Graduates who successfully complete the Didactic Program in Dietetics results in the receipt of a DPD Verification Statement, which qualifies students to apply for a post-baccalaureate supervised-practice program (e.g., a dietetic internship), which is a requirement for eligibility to take the National Registration Examination for Dietitians and earn the RD/RDN credential.</p> <p>Effective January 1, 2024, the Commission on Dietetic Registration (CDR) will require a minimum of a master's degree to be eligible to take the credentialing exam to become a registered dietitian nutritionist (RDN). In addition, CDR requires that individuals complete coursework and supervised practice in program(s) accredited by the Accreditation Council for Education in Nutrition and Dietetics (ACEND). In most states, graduates also must obtain licensure or certification to practice. Qualified nutrition practitioners are encouraged to consult their specific statutes and/or facility policies for clarification.</p>
