Job Summary

Provides psychotherapy, both group and individual, to juveniles who have been adjudicated for sex offenses, as well as psycho education group and family therapy.

Essential Functions

1. Provides clinical intervention to students in Accountability Based Sex Offender Program II including individual, group and family therapy.
2. Participates in clinical team meetings to discuss students' progress and appropriate treatment strategies.
3. Facilitates psycho educational groups to teach various concepts such as (but not limited to) emotion management and tolerance for cultural diversity.
4. Completes documentation relative to provision of services, risk assessments, and other tasks relative to students' case management.
5. Plans activities for the Accountability Based Sex Offender Program II student community.
6. Participates in community meetings to resolve problems within the community.

Supervisory Responsibility

May be responsible for training, assisting or assigning tasks to others. May provide input to performance reviews of other employees.

The above essential functions are representative of major duties of positions in this job classification. Specific duties and responsibilities may vary based upon departmental needs. Other duties may be assigned similar to the above consistent with the knowledge, skills and abilities required for the job. Not all of the duties may be assigned to a position.

III	Under general guidance, plans, conducts and leads complex assignments and areas of functional responsibility. Acting with substantial latitude for unreviewed action, applies broad subject matter expertise to solution of significant issues or development of new programs, services, processes or other initiatives to meet the University's goals in a specific area. Recommends changes in procedures or policies, and leads change initiatives to completion, often persuading or coordinating work of others outside own department.	Possesses and applies comprehensive knowledge of a particular field of specialization to the completion of complex assignments. Also possesses strong knowledge of related fields, processes, policies or areas of operation which affect, or are affected by, own area. 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Minimum Required Education and Experience

- Level I** Masters degree in discipline appropriate to position with no experience.
- Level II** Masters degree in discipline appropriate to position plus 2 years experience. Experience must include at least 2 years at the preceding level or equivalent.
- Level III** Masters degree in discipline appropriate to position plus 4 years experience. Experience must include at least 2 years at the preceding level or equivalent.

Focus of Experience

Experience in providing mental health services to adolescents

Substitutions allowed for Education:

Indicated education is required; no substitutions allowed.

Substitutions allowed for Experience:

Physical Requirements/ADA

No unusual physical requirements. Requires no heavy lifting, and nearly all work is performed in a comfortable indoor facility.
