JOB SUMMARY

Coordinates and oversees all clinical aspects of a residential treatment program for juveniles who have been adjudicated for sex offenses.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Manages, directs, and coordinates institutional clinical services and programs.
- Plans and coordinates institutional treatment services and program activities in conjunction with academic and clinical staff.
- Ensures that the program meets or exceeds training standard requirements of the American Correctional Associates.
- Plans and implements weekly therapeutic group meetings for staff and residents.
- Ensures all clinical activities meet expectations for implementation of the Good Lives treatment model.
- Coordinates clinical program activities with Educational and Residential Life programs and various Department of Youth Services programs and activities, as well as coordinates critical incident reporting.
- Reviews and signs release documents and other clinical reports and records.

The responsibilities listed above show the typical duties for jobs in this classification. Actual tasks may differ depending on the department's needs. Other similar duties may be assigned with discretion of the supervisor. Not every duty will apply to every position, and the amount of time spent on each task can change based on department needs.
