JOB SUMMARY

The Director of Technical Production directs and oversees Auburn University Theatre productions including scenic production for the Department of Theatre and Dance.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Oversees and supervises the Auburn University Department of Theatre and Dance (AUTD) Scenic, Paint, Lighting, Sound, and Props areas including the building, implementation, and delivery of all scenery, rigging, automation, lighting, sound, props, and special effects elements for all AUTD productions.
- Collaborates and develops calendars, schedules, and cost estimates for implementing the Scenic, Paint, Lighting, Sound, and Props elements of AUTD productions. Manages the reviewing, drafting, constructing, painting, installation/load in of all scenic elements.
- Oversees hanging, circuiting, focusing of lighting instruments; building, pulling, modifying, and purchasing of all prop elements; rigging, and cabling sound equipment; attending all technical rehearsals and design and production meetings.
- Manages the development and maintenance of production and show expenditures as well as the submission of receipts to administrators according to set deadlines and processes.
- Maintains the facilities including all area equipment, tools, stock goods, and scenery at the AUTD facilities. Maintains and organizes inventory of AUTD tools, equipment, props, and facilities. Supports the technical needs of facility rentals by working with the Director of Production, Artistic Director, Communication and Marketing Specialist in the scheduling, logistics, and implementing the technical requirements of outside events.
- Ensures the development of engineering and construction solutions for production design, including structural design, rigging solutions, automation solutions, and material specification and procurement.
- Oversees AUTD workplace safety programs and implements, develops new protocols, and implements industry standard processes to maintain safe and best practices in a dynamic workplace.
- Serves as the instructor of record for at least one section of THEA Practicum course per semester. Teaches, mentors, and supervises students in the realization of all technical elements in the areas of scenic, paint, lighting, sound, and props, for AUTD productions.

The responsibilities listed above show the typical duties for jobs in this classification. Actual tasks may differ depending on the department's needs. Other similar duties may be assigned with discretion of the supervisor. Not every duty will apply to every position, and the amount of time spent on each task can change based on department needs.
