Job Summary

Provides technical and supervisory support for the Auburn University Canine Detection Training Program.

Essential Functions

- 3. Performs quality assurance inspections and provides evaluative reports of training activities.
- 4. Oversees narcotics training aids used by Canine Detection Training Center.
- 5. Evaluates prospective canines for participation in program.

Supervisory Responsibility

Full supervisory responsibility for other employees is a major responsibility and includes training, evaluating, and making or recommending pay, promotion or other employment decisions.

Substitutions allowed for Experience:

Minimum Required Knowledge

Knowledge of canine training techniques, care, handling, and State and Federal regulations related to the use of explosives and narcotics.

Certification or Licensure Requirements

None Required.

Physical Requirements/ADA

Frequent heavy or intense physical requirements, combined with exposure to a number of disagreeable elements, such as heat, cold, noise, dust, dirt, chemicals. Injury may require professional treatment or hospitalization. Constant precautions required.

Routine deadlines; usually sufficient lead time; variance in work volume seasonal and predictable; priorities can be anticipated; some interruptions are present; involves occasional exposure to demands and pressures from persons other than immediate supervisor.

Job frequently requires standing, walking, reaching, stooping/kneeling/crouching/crawling, talking, hearing, handling objects with hands, and lifting up to 100 pounds.

Job occasionally requires sitting, climbing or balancing, and lifting more than 100 pounds.
