JOB SUMMARY

Assists dairy clinicians in the management and supervision of the dairy herd and facilities.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Oversees and leads in equipment set-up, milking, and feeding of dairy herd.
- Maintains milking equipment by inspecting and replacing equipment parts, ordering supplies, and maintaining inventory levels.
- Assists clinicians with medical treatments, surgical preparation, and medical records, ensuring all hospitalized dairy cows are properly documented.
- Herds cattle to and from dairy facility and pastures to accommodate space and grazing needs.
- Maintains milking barn by ensuring proper cleaning of facilities and reporting malfunctions of equipment to appropriate personnel.
- Performs milking duties during months when students are not assigned to the dairy herd.
- Maintains all dairy herd records.
- Monitors the overall condition of beef and dairy pastures.

The responsibilities listed above show the typical duties for jobs in this classification. Actual tasks may differ depending on the department's needs. Other similar duties may be assigned with discretion of the supervisor. Not every duty will apply to every position, and the amount of time spent on each task can change based on department needs.

SUPERVISORY RESPONSIBILITIES

Supervisory Responsibility	May be responsible for training, assisting or assigning tasks to others. May provide input to performance reviews of other employees.
