JOB SUMMARY

The University Landscape Architect (ULA) serves as the primary strategic steward of Auburn University's physical campus environment. Reporting to the University Architect, the ULA provides expert design leadership and technical guidance to ensure the campus remains functional, sustainable, and aesthetically consistent with Auburn's historic "Spirit of Place." This is a highly collaborative, individual contributor role that requires exceptional professional diplomacy. The ULA acts as the bridge between high-level capital planning and operational reality, working as a lateral partner to the Director of Landscape Services to ensure that new designs are not only beautiful and strategic but also maintainable and operationally sound.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Leads the evaluation and approval of landscape and site plans for all capital projects to ensure compliance with the Campus Master Plan, Landscape Master Plan, and Auburn University Design & Construction Standards. Directs external design consultants to ensure deliverables meet Auburn's aesthetic and maintainability requirements. Oversees the design of "Signature Spaces" and high-visibility landscape projects.
- Maintains and updates the Landscape Master Plan and related planning tenets governing pedestrian networks, plazas, and open spaces. Collaborates with the Director of Campus Planning & Space Management for the Land Use Agreement processes and outdoor space allocations. Serves as the technical expert for landscape-related standards in the Facilities Management Design and Construction Standards.
- Collaborates closely with the Director of Landscape Services to align design intent with long-term maintenance capabilities, plant palettes, and irrigation standards. Consults with Landscape Operations on tree management strategies and "constructability" reviews.
- Serves as a power user of the University's GIS and space management platforms to conduct site analysis, track campus canopy data, and support evidence-based land use decisions. Oversees campus-wide exterior wayfinding, signage, and identity systems in partnership with Campus Planning and Space Management.
- Represents the University in "Town and Gown" collaborations with the City of Auburn regarding land use, mobility, and public-facing streetscapes. Supports the academic mission by identifying opportunities for the campus landscape to serve as a "living laboratory" for students and faculty research.

The responsibilities listed above show the typical duties for jobs in this classification. Actual tasks may differ depending on the department's needs. Other similar duties may be assigned with discretion of the supervisor. Not every duty will apply to every position, and the amount of time spent on each task can change based on department needs.

SUPERVISORY RESPONSIBILITIES
